

NOTES ON AUTHORS

ØYSTEIN LINNEBO received his M.A. in mathematics from the University of Oslo (1995) and his Ph.D. in philosophy from Harvard University in 2002 with a dissertation entitled “Mathematics with Numbers: A Naturalistic Defense of Mathematical Platonism”. Since then he has been a Postdoctoral Fellow at the University of Oslo, where he continues to work on the philosophies of logic, mathematics, and language, as well as all things Fregean. He has published articles in *Bulletin of Symbolic Logic*, *Dialectica*, *Notre Dame Journal of Formal Logic*, *Noûs*, and *Philosophia Mathematica*.

MARCO RUFFINO is Professor Adjunto in the Philosophy Department of the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro (UFRJ). He previously taught at the State University of Campinas (UNICAMP) and at the Friedrich Schiller University (FSU) in Germany. He received his Ph.D. in philosophy from the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) in 1996. He is currently the chief editor of *Manuscrito*. He has published a number of articles on Frege, Russell and Wittgenstein.

MAITE EZCURDIA is a research fellow of the Instituto de Investigaciones Filosóficas of the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM). Her work is mostly in the philosophy of language and the philosophy of mind. She has published many papers both in English and in Spanish on the notion of sense and the nature of indexicals (amongst other topics). She has recently co-edited a collection on *qualia* (*La Naturaleza de la Experiencia*, UNAM, 2003) and edited a volume on the philosophy of language (*Orayen: de la forma lógica al significado*, forthcoming). 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she is co-editing and due to appear as a supplementary volume of the Canadian Journal of Philosophy (*New Essays in the Philosophy of Language and Mind*).

SIMON EVNINE got his PhD at UCLA. He is currently Assistant Professor at the University of Miami and works in the areas of Epistemology, Philosophy of Mind and Metaphysics.

MARKUS STEPANIANS studied Philosophy at the Universities of Hamburg and Harvard. Since 1998 he is Assistant Professor at the University of Saarland. He is the author of *Frege und Husserl über Urteilen und Denken*, Schöningh: Mentis 1998 and *Frege – eine Einführung*, Junius 2001.

OSWALDO CHATEAUBRIAND is professor of logic and philosophy at the Catholic University of Rio de Janeiro. His publications are in the areas of philosophy of logic, philosophy of mathematics and philosophy of language. He received his Ph.D. in Philosophy from the University of California at Berkeley and has also taught at the University of Washington, Harvard and Cornell. He is president of the Brazilian Logic Society and is a member of the Center for Logic, Epistemology and the History of Science of the State University of Campinas.

DIRK GREIMANN holds a Ph.D. in philosophy from the Ludwig-Maximilian-University in Munich, Germany. He was formerly *Privatdozent* in the Department of Philosophy at this same university, and is currently professor of philosophy at the Federal University of Santa Maria (UFSM), Brazil. His main fields of interest are semantics, ontology and metaethics. He published several articles in journals like

Inquiry, Dialectica, Erkenntnis, Zeitschrift für philosophische Forschung, Grazer philosophische Studien, Kant-Studien and *Facta Philosophica*, as well as the book *Frege's Konzeption der Wahrheit* (Hildesheim: Olms, 2003). He is also the editor of *Das Wahre und das Falsche: Studien zu Frege's Auffassung on Wahrheit* (Hildesheim: Olms, 2003).

THOMAS RICKETTS is professor of philosophy at Northwestern University. He is the author of papers on Frege, Russell, Wittgenstein, Carnap, and Quine.

ERICH H. RECK received an M.A. in mathematics from the University of Bonn, Germany, and a Ph.D. in philosophy from the University of Chicago. Currently he is Associate Professor in philosophy at the University of California at Riverside. He has published articles in the areas of early analytic philosophy, history and philosophy of logic, and philosophy of mathematic, is the editor of *From Frege to Wittgenstein: Perspectives on Early Analytic Philosophy* (Oxford University Press, 2002), and co-editor and translator of *Frege's Lectures on Logic: Carnap's Student Notes* (Open Court, 2004).

RICHARD HECK received his PhD from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1991 and has been teaching at Harvard since. He is the author of several papers on Frege's philosophy of arithmetic, a book on which is in preparation. He has also written on the philosophies of mathematics, logic, language, and mind. His current research concerns the nature of linguistic performance.
