JUAN ADOLFO BONACCINI studied in Buenos Aires, Rio de Janeiro, and Freiburg im Breisgau. He has been Professor of Philosophy at the Federal University of Rio Grande do Norte, Brazil, since 1994. His main interests are German idealism, modern epistemology and ontology, metaphysics and moral philosophy.
